

Do Does Did

1. Can be used to ask and answer questions

Do you like ice cream? ... Yes, I do.

Does Jason want to come with us? ... Yes, he does.

Does Luke run? ... Yes, he does.

Did Jennifer eat dinner? ... Yes, she did.

2. Can be combined with *Not* to make a negative statement

- Do + not = don't I do not want ice cream. = I don't want ice cream.
 - Does + not = doesn't His wife does not dance. = His wife doesn't dance.
 - Did + not = Didn't They did not offer to help. = They didn't offer to help.

3. Can be used as a verb or with a verb

- I don't sing. = used as a verb
- I don't like singing = used with the verb "like"
